What to avoid

- Don't reuse work
 - Your own (previous semester, previous course) without permission.
 - From others!
 - Content from web should be cited.
- A helper who hands you a solution is no help at all.
 - Get help by having someone look at your code and help you work through the problem.
- You CAN:
 - Use any code I publish this semester without citing.
 - Look at another student's work to help *them*.

AI Tools

- **AI OK to support your learning, and coding**
 - OK to have it auto-complete a couple lines of code that you can write.
 - OK to ask it to explain code, or help find a bug.
- **You must be the primary brain involved!**
 - You must do the **design**.
 - You must be **able to write the code** that it does.
- If used, you must **cite** it for the code it writes.
 - In some ways, **AI is automated plagiarism**:
If it writes enough of your code to be too similar to others, then **you are responsible for the academic dishonesty**.
- No AI tools on quizzes!
